Fund aim

The investment objective of the Euro Corporate Bond Fund is to provide a total return in excess of that generated by the iBoxx Euro Corporates Index by investing primarily in Euro denominated investment grade corporate bonds and other fixed and floating rate securities. The Fund may invest up to 20% of its net assets in contingent convertible bonds.

The Fund may make use of a variety of instruments / strategies in order to achieve the Fund's objective including, but not limited to, forward rate notes, forward foreign exchange contracts (including non-deliverable forwards), interest rate futures, bond futures and OTC swaps (such as interest rate swaps, credit default swaps, credit default swaps on indices and total return swaps).

This is a Luxembourg SICAV Fund, regulated by the Commission de Surveillance du Secteur Financier (CSSF).

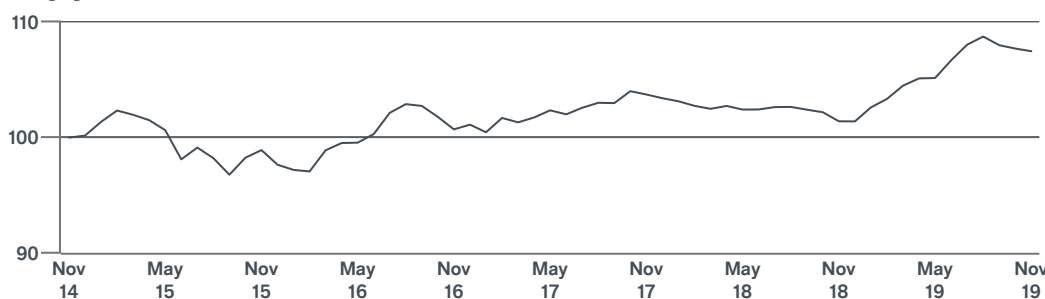

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The Morningstar Analyst Rating for Funds is a forward-looking analysis of a fund. Morningstar has identified five key areas crucial to predicting the future success of a fund: People, Parent, Process, Performance and Price. The pillars are used in determining the Morningstar Analyst Rating for a fund. Morningstar Analyst Ratings are assigned on a five-tier scale running from Gold to Negative. The top three ratings, Gold, Silver and Bronze all indicate that Morningstar's analysts think highly of a fund; the difference between them corresponds to differences in the level of analyst conviction in a fund's ability to outperform its benchmark and peers through time, within the context of the level of risk taken over the long term. Neutral represents funds in which Morningstar's analysts don't have a strong positive or negative conviction over the long term and Negative represents funds that possess at least one flaw that Morningstar's analysts believe is likely to significantly hamper future performance over the long term. Long term is defined as a full market cycle or at least five years.
