Objective and investment policy

The Fund aims to provide an income with the potential for capital growth over the long term.

Performance target: To outperform the Markit iBoxx GBP Non-Gilts greater than 15 years to maturity Index by 1% per annum, before the deduction of charges, over any 5 year period.

The Fund invests at least 80% of its assets in Sterling-denominated investment grade (equivalent to BBB rated or higher) corporate bonds, typically with maturities of 15 years or more. (Longer dated bonds are generally more sensitive to changes in interest rates and may at times exhibit significant volatility.)

The Fund is actively managed with reference to the Markit iBoxx GBP Non-Gilts greater than 15 years to maturity Index, which is broadly representative of the bonds in which it may invest, as this forms the basis of the Fund's performance target. The investment manager has discretion to choose investments for the Fund with weightings different to the index or not in the index, but at times the Fund may hold investments similar to the index.

As an additional means of assessing the performance of the Fund, the IA Sterling Corporate Bond sector average, which is based on a peer group of broadly similar funds, may also provide a useful comparator.

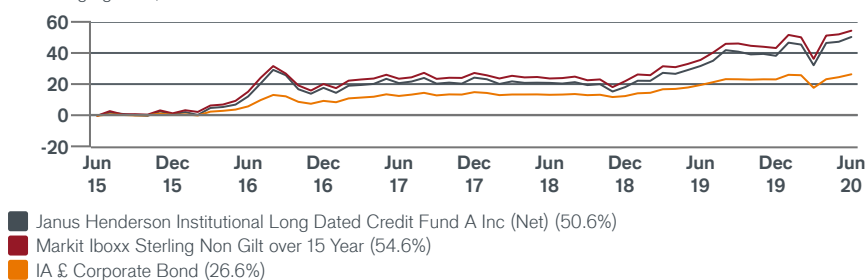
Additional information

Please note that as of 06 March 2019, Hartej Singh has been replaced by James Briggs as a co-manager of this fund. The month-end duration of the fund (in years) is shown on the left. Duration measures the sensitivity of a bond fund to interest rate changes; the larger the figure, the more sensitive is the bond fund to a movement in interest rates.

Performance for the share class is calculated at 12pm and performance of the index is calculated as at close of business. Note that any differences among portfolio securities currencies, share class currencies, and your home currency will expose you to currency risk.

What are the risks specific to this fund?

- When interest rates rise (or fall), the prices of different securities will be affected differently. In particular, bond values generally fall when interest rates rise or are expected to rise. This is especially true for bonds with a longer time to maturity. A high portion of this fund is invested in longer maturity bonds and so rising interest rates can pose a significant risk to capital.
- The Fund may invest in contingent convertible bonds (CoCos), which can fall sharply in value if the financial strength of an issuer weakens and a predetermined trigger event causes the bonds to be converted into shares of the issuer or to be partly or wholly written off.
- The Fund could lose money if a counterparty with which it trades becomes unwilling or unable to meet its obligations to the Fund.
- An issuer of a bond (or money market instrument) may become unable or unwilling to pay interest or repay capital to the Fund. If this happens or the market perceives this may happen, the value of the bond will fall.
